How does the Plant Pass scheme work?

Plant Pass requires plant producers to manage and minimise the risk of pest and pathogen exposure in their nurseries.

The Plant Pass team works with and supports producers to improve their biosecurity management systems.

Producers can apply to become a Plant Pass registered nursery via the Plant Pass website and/or join one of our workshops or webinars for more information.

To progress to coming a certified nursery an audit is undertaken to assess risk management practices.

Certified nurseries are promoted as trusted suppliers that are recognised for protecting their plants, customers, and our environment.
